



2024 SPABA Grant Competition

Now accepting Research, Application and Dissemination Proposals

COMPETITION OBJECTIVE

For this grant competition cycle, the Speech Pathology and Applied Behavior Analysis SIG (SPABA) will provide one Giri Hegde Research Grant, one Barb Esch Application Grant and one Nikia Dower Dissemination Grant to those who conduct empirical research or who facilitate dissemination of knowledge and collaboration between speech pathologists and behavior analysts.

- **Research Projects** should advance the evidence base for behavior-analytic conceptualization for treatment of speech, language, communication, and feeding disorders.
- **Application Projects** should involve effective use of the science-based principles of behavior by SLPs and may include research studies that contribute to the science of ABA and/or studies that reflect the mission of SPABA.
- **Dissemination projects** can be cross-discipline dissemination of accurate information about speech pathology and behavior analysis.

AWARD

- One grant of **\$500.00** will be awarded to the winning **proposal in each category**.
- Each completed application will entitle the applicant to one year of free membership in the SPABA SIG.

Notes to APPLICANTS

- **Applicants for the Research Grant** must be students enrolled in a Bachelors, Masters or PhD program in Speech-Language Pathology, Behavior Analysis, Psychology, Special Education, or a related field.
- **Applicants for the Application or Dissemination Grants** can be graduate students *or* practitioners. Application studies may also be research studies (as in the case of single-case research design studies).
 - Students are encouraged to pick the category that best applies to their work *and* provide a letter of support whether applying to the research category or the application category.
- **As a practitioner, you may only apply for the application or dissemination grants.**

ELIGIBLE PROPOSAL ACTIVITIES

- **Empirical Research Projects:**
 - Projects can be new or ongoing.
 - Thesis or other research projects that are a requirement for completion of a graduate program are eligible activities.
 - Unpublished, completed research will also be considered.
 - Research should deal with some aspect that involves behavior analysis (e.g., verbal behavior, perspectives of behavioral interventions, qualitative measures combined with SCED)

- **Application Projects:**
 - Projects can be new or ongoing.
 - Projects must reflect the mission of SPABA.
 - Projects must demonstrate effective application of behavioral technologies by SLPs OR dissemination of behavior analysis to SLPs.

- **Dissemination Projects:**
 - Projects can be new or ongoing.
 - Projects must reflect the mission of SPABA.
 - Projects can be cross-discipline dissemination of accurate information about speech pathology and behavior analysis.
 - Projects can be qualitative in nature but must be conceptually systematic and reflect the contribution to practice or science.

PROPOSAL (all components are required)

1. Application Form
2. Proposal (5 pages maximum, not including references – double spaced, 1" margins, 10 pt font minimum)
Proposals should include the following components for reviewers to evaluate:
 - Empirical Research Category:
 - Outline of research plans including the research question, rationale, and 2-5 references that set the occasion for your study.
 - Description of methods including: a reliable system of measurement; an experimental design appropriate for the research question; technological descriptions of all procedures; descriptions of relevant principles of behavior or SLP OR if completing qualitative research or mixed methods, appropriate measurement of key perspectives/insights obtained through interviews and/or qualitative analysis. Statement of how the study contributed to the science and practice of ABA or SLP, whether the study is qualitative, quantitative or mixed methods.
 - Quantitative research submissions will be scored in the following areas:
 - **Behavioral** (Precise behavioral definitions; reliable and frequent measurement),
 - **Analytic** (*Design sufficient to demonstrate functional relation*),
 - **Technological** (Description sufficient for replication by other professionals),
 - **Conceptually Systematic** (Goals or procedures reflect principles of behavior),
 - **Contribution to Practice or Science**
 - Qualitative research and mixed methods submissions will be scored in the following areas:
 - Contribution to practice
 - Technological (Description of procedures sufficient for replication by other professionals)
 - Complete, iterative and thorough analysis of qualitative data
 - Application and Dissemination Categories:
 - Outline of project plans including your objectives, rationale, and 2-5 references used to develop the idea or materials.
 - Description of methods including behavioral goals; a reliable system of measurement; technological descriptions of all procedures; descriptions of relevant principles of behavior or SLP.
 - Statement of how the project changed a client's behavior or contributed to the understanding of science-based principles of behavior among SLPs or vice versa.

- A clear description of how you are disseminating information relevant to ABA and/or SLP OR a clear description of the application of your work to ABA and/or SLP
 - Submissions will be scored in the following areas:
 - **Technological** (Description sufficient for replication by other professionals in the case of qualitative research or mixed methods studies)
 - **Conceptually Systematic** (Goals or procedures reflect principles of behavior), and
 - **Contribution to or Understanding of ABA by SLPs.**
3. Letter of support from project supervisor if you are a student applicant (1/2 page maximum – the letter should confirm that you are a full-time student and that you are primarily responsible (e.g., principal investigator, project coordinator) for the submitted proposal.
 4. Curriculum vitae – Please provide a copy of your current vitae.

REVIEW COMMITTEE CRITERIA

- A panel of three reviewers will independently score each proposal on the following criteria: relevance to behavior analysis and SLP, clarity and feasibility of project plan, and anticipated or documented contribution to behavior-analytic research or practice. The authors of the Research Projects, Application Projects and Dissemination Projects with the highest average scores will receive a \$500 grant.

REPORT BY GRANT RECIPIENTS

- If your proposal is funded, please plan to **virtually** present your project at the Speech Pathology Applied Behavior Analysis Special Interest Group's Grant Award meeting to be held in **October, 2024** (date forthcoming).
